	AAU is committed to: 1. Minimizing Single-Use Disposables: Actively reducing the use of single-use disposable items (e.g., cutlery, plates, cups, napkins, and packaging materials) and replacing them with reusable, biodegradable, or compostable alternatives. Implementing programs and practices that discourage the unnecessary use of disposables and encourage a culture of reuse and waste reduction. 2. Sustainable Procurement: Prioritizing the purchase of products that are reusable, made from recycled materials, or are capable of being recycled or composted. Working with suppliers and contractors to reduce packaging and to preferentially select products that have minimal environmental impact. 3. Waste Reduction and Recycling: Promoting recycling and proper waste segregation on campus to ensure effective management of disposable items. Facilitating initiatives such as composting programs to manage biodegradable waste responsibly. 4. Education and Awareness: Raising awareness among the university community about the environmental impacts of disposable items and the importance of reducing
