يهدف برنامج القيادات الشابة إلى دعم وتمكين الشابات والشباب بصفتهم رواداً للتغيير إلى تحسين وتطوير وتنفيذ نماذج أفكارهم الإبداعية الأولية والمؤثرة والمستدامة والتي تشمل المؤسسات المجتمعية واللاربحية والمؤسسات الغير حكومية والمبادرات المختلفة بالإضافة إلى الحملات.

ما هو نموذج الحل؟ النموذج هو شكل أو تمثيل (عرض) مرئي لأفكار مشاريع جديدة (مشروعك) حيث يمكن أن تكون سلع أو خدمات. يمكن للنماذج أن تأخذ أشكالاً مختلفة؛ على سبيل المثال عرض تقديمي أو عرض ثلاثي الأبعاد.

يسعى برنامج القيادات الشابة وبكفاءة عالية إلى تسريع تنفيذ الحلول الإبداعية والتي تستهدف الصعوبات والتحديات التنموية في الأردن.

من خلال المشاركة في هذا البرنامج، سيكون لديك فرصة العمر ل:

What is a prototyped solution? A prototype is a model or a visual representation of new project ideas (your solution), whether these are products or services. Prototypes can take many forms: from a slideshow to a 3D representation. YLP3 seeks to accelerate innovative solutions that can address national development challenges in Jordan effectively

By participating in this Program, you will have a chance of a lifetime to:

- ✚ Develop your leadership potential
- ✚ Develop your skills in various social innovation approaches and methodologies
- ✚ Strengthen your gender sensitive lens and skills
- ✚ Improve your advocacy and presentation skills
- ✚ Network with young leaders and innovators

All participants will receive a certificate of participation. A small number of individuals from participating countries might be selected to participate in a regional event at the end of the year to further enhance their learning skills and networking.

Eligibility Criteria

- Age between 19 – 29

- Have an innovative solution in progress
- No previous experience/participation in UN/UNDP events/initiatives
- High motivation and interest in social work and social change

- Capability and willingness to participate actively in follow up

- Shortlisted applicants will be interviewed.
- Selected participants will receive a confirmation e-mail or phone call.
- Disadvantaged young women and men, especially those with special needs are highly encouraged to apply.

Youth Action for the 2030 Agenda: Accelerating Innovative Solutions for Sustainable Development

Concept Note – DRAFT
March 2017

Context

The youth generation in the Arab States is the largest the region has witnessed over the past 50 years, with more than 60% of the population under the age of 30, according to UNDP's "Arab Human Development Report 2016: Youth and the Prospects for Human Development in a Changing Reality" (AHDR).¹ Embedded within this statistic is a diversity of populations: young women and men, youth with disabilities, youth from minorities and marginalized groups, etc., all of whom come with both common and distinct needs and demands at the same time.

Such is the case with young women, many of whom face legal and social discrimination and violence that hinder their progress. Gender-based violence hits women and young girls hard in some Arab countries leaving them vulnerable and suffering from the aftermath of this violence. In conflict countries, the situation grows harder and more complicated for young women and the impact is more severe. "By most assessments, gender equality and women's empowerment are more restricted in Arab countries than in other regions"². This factor has increased the burden on young women to claim their space and call for effective role and contribution in their countries. It is worth noting that investing in young women through building their capacities will eventually affect the generations and future of the Arab region.

Furthermore, young women and men in the Arab region face extremely high unemployment rates and difficult economic conditions. Again, according to the AHDR, unemployment among youth in the Arab region is the highest in the world. In 2014, unemployment for Arab youth aged 15-24 years old was more than twice the global average, reaching 29.7%.³ The unemployment rate for Arab women is twice that of young men, with the figures reaching 24% and 47%, respectively. These numbers are expected to increase; by 2020, the region will need over 60 million new jobs to absorb the number of workforce entrants and stabilize youth unemployment.

The Arab region has the lowest rates of women's business ownership among emerging regions, according to the World Bank's most recent figures (2011- 2013). The proportion of adult women who engage in entrepreneurial ventures is less than half that of men and lower than in other developing regions. There is a pressing need to create alternative

paths to action and social change by enabling non-traditional stakeholders, such as Arab youth, to help write new narratives for development challenges.



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On a positive note, although entrepreneurship is still perceived as a risky venture by many, women and men entrepreneurs have become progressively more visible across the Arab world. In response to the growing number of entrepreneurs, national entrepreneurship institutions and support systems have expanded to include new incubators, accelerators, innovation labs, fabrication labs, angel investors, and so on.

In addition to gender inequality and unemployment, youth exclusion is strongly evident, often crossing with other forms of marginalization linked to location, culture and/or community. This undercuts both development and social cohesion, yet it remains poorly recognized. Social norms continue to side-line youth in many places, treating political and economic participation as the prerogative of older people.

Youth Leadership Programme (YLP)

UNDP Arab States sees an opportunity to support and strengthen social innovation of Arab youth, especially young women, so that they can realize their potential and contribute to the economic growth and social stability of the region. Empowering youth in this way requires tapping into their energies and providing them with the skills, platforms and access they need to succeed in the current landscape. There is opportunity also to broaden the horizons of young men and women to debate, discuss and explore issues that hinder the progress of youth in the Arab region.

UNDP Arab States launched the Youth Leadership Programme (YLP) in 2015, based on the vision that young people are a key resource for solving the problems of development in the region. Building on the success and lessons learned from YLP1 (2015) and YLP2 (2016) and on the momentum that was created, UNDP Arab States is launching YLP 3 to support young men and women from across the region in exploring innovative approaches to addressing sustainable development challenges, with a specific focus on gender equality and women's empowerment. Over the course of the year, participating youth will receive ongoing support, including technical advice and targeted mentoring to develop their skills in various social innovation approaches and methodologies and to bring their ideas and initiatives to fruition.

YLP3 Objectives

YLP3 aims to support and empower young women and men change-makers to design and implement innovative, impactful and sustainable development solutions, whether these be social enterprises, nonprofits, NGOs, initiatives, or campaigns. YLP3 will contribute to the achievement of the SDGs, with gender equality and women's empowerment the main focus of the programme; as change-makers, participating youth will lead the efforts to improve gender equality and women's empowerment in the Arab region.

The objectives are:

- Promote and support innovative thinking and leadership among youth
- Build networks of young men and women who are able to create change and positive sustainable impact in their communities, countries and region



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- Showcase the achievements of young men and women as change makers in their communities
- Promote the production of knowledge on gender equality and social innovation in English, Arabic and French

Building on the first two phases of the Youth Leadership Programme (YLP1 and 2), the theme for the third phase of the programme (YLP3) will be *accelerating innovative solutions for sustainable development*. YLP3 will focus on supporting the development of youth's innovative solutions to addressing sustainable development challenges. This will be done through an open call for innovations, provision of technical advice and mentorship to participating youth as they refine their initiatives, and networking with potential investors, all designed to enable YLP3 participants to realize and implement their solutions beyond YLP.

Target Participants

- Young women and men aged 19–29 who are social activists, entrepreneurs, leaders, change makers. Applicants should already have a well-developed solution in the form of an early-stage prototype.
- The target is 60% women and 40% men
- Special focus on disadvantaged young women and men, especially those with special needs
- Young men and women with interest in social work, gender equality and women's empowerment topics will be prioritized
