Innovative projects exhibition at our Business Incubator

Dr. Maher Al-Hourani, Chairman of the Board of Directors at our University, has inaugurated the exhibition of innovative projects in our business incubator in the presence of Prof. Sari Hamdan, and a group of the presidential and academic staff.

The exhibition covered and supported eight projects, which were represented by Dr. Omar Abdel-Jaber, Director of the Business Incubator, to discuss the projects and explain more about linking them with local and regional companies in order to activate them.

The Incubated Projects:

Smart Home Controlled by Brain Signals:

Enabling people to control their home devices by programming them into reading certain brain signals

ElectroPot:

A smart electronic project that allows crops to be watered remotely through smart pots and mobile application

E-Regulator:

A project specialized in manufacturing devices that reduce and regulate the consumption of water by 50% and 30% of gas with security features in case of a gas leak.



Smart Car:

A smart car with high-tech sensors to prevent collision and maneuver automatically.

Ironvest:

It is part of a huge project under the title "Iron-Man Suit" with a power regulator to sustain energy from a week up to 6 months.

Sophia's Nature:

A project that is specialized in natural cosmetics and skin products.

Smart Home:

A smart home model with features that senses the arrival of the homeowner, control the home temperature and the basic features of the house through an application.

Smart Cart:

A technology that converts regular airport luggage cart into a smart cart to help travelers reach their gates as well as containing smart features that facilitate their stay at the airport.

Abdullah Al-Tahla, an engineering student, has achieved the first place in the Sabre after defeating Jordan Fencing Federation player Ahmed Amawi.


On the other hand, Hamza Zubeidi, a player and business student, got the second place for the Epee.

Jordan's Team 'Leaf a Mark' claim victory at the Global Goals World Cup Finals in Iceland

In 2015 EIR, a Danish based and women-run football foundation, pioneered the world of sport by building the Global Goals World Cup (GGWCUP).

A GGWCUP is an all-women 5v5 football tournament and to participate each team must adopt and take action for one of the 17 Global Goals. The teams are ranked by how they promote the Goal on and off the field. The tournament promotes a playful, healthy and active lifestyle for women by hopefully bringing the GGWCUP to all the 193 countries that adopted the United Nations 17 Global Goals by 2030.

Team Leaf a Mark played for Goal 15, Life on Land, committing to plant 1 million trees by 2030 and change the 1% green in Jordan.

Jordan's Team 'Leaf a Mark' were declared winners at the 5th annual Global Goals World Cup (GGWCUP) Finals held in Reykjavik, Iceland during the Reykjavik Global Forum – Women Leaders Conference.

In May 2021, Team Leaf of Mark was crowned champion of the first ever Global Goals World Cup in the Middle East held in Jordan that qualified them to compete in the

GGWCUP Finals in Iceland.Over the past two years, Leaf a Mark has campaigned for a greener Jordan by launching online awareness campaigns, carrying out school visits, planting thousands of trees, distributing planting kits to children and setting up crowdfunding campaigns to plant fruit-bearing trees for underprivileged families to create a sustainable source of income.


