On an exclusive invitation from the jurist of international trade law and maritime Prof. Jason Chuah, Dr. law, Dirar Al-Daboubi, Head of Private Law Department at our Law Faculty took part in the International Maritime and its policies 12th Conference. The conference was held by City University of London where Dr. Al-Daboubi presented a research paper under the title "Freight Guarantees for Sea Transported Cargo". The University of London Maritime Law Research Group & China-European Society for International Trade jointly organized this conference with the support the world's of most distinguished publishing houses for legal books and researches such as Thomson Reuters Maxwell) and (Sweet & Lawtext Publishing.

The paper presented by Dr. Dirar Al-Daboubi was the only paper presented by a delegate from a university in the MENA region including 19 research papers submitted by a number of lawyers and arbitrators in the field of maritime trade, in addition to academics researchers from prestigious universities from around the world.

Al-Ahliyya Amman University, in collaboration with the Arab Forum for Smart Cities, held a workshop under the title "Turning Jordanian Cities into Smart Cities - Reality & Ambition". The workshop was in participation with the Greater Amman Municipality, Ministry of Digital Economy and Entrepreneurship, Information & Communications Technology Association (ICTA), several Jordanian municipalities in addition to competent experts and academics under the guidance of Prof. Sari Hamdan.

In his speech, Prof. Hamdan expressed the significance of smart cities in improving the level and quality of life and keeping pace with developments in regards to the change of human needs while referring to few studies related to the revolution of smart cities. Prof. Hamdan also noted that students' dissertations and researches of academics do contribute in providing traffic solutions to decision makers in Jordan.

For his part, Dean of our Engineering Faculty, Prof. Mutassim Abdul Jaber, stated that our University is the first to embrace and offer the only MA program specialized in Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS).

For their part, Engineer Samira Dahiat, Executive Director of the Arab Forum for Smart Cities stated that the workshop rises from the vision of the Forum towards activating public-private partnership and strengthening partnerships to regulate the role of

science, technology and innovation in achieving sustainable development.

The workshop included five presentations by Eng. Nidal Al Bitar, CEO of ICTA, Mr. Sultan Al-Kharabsheh, Executive Director of the Directorate of Information & Communication Technology in Greater Amman Municipality, Eng. Hind Al-Hyari, Director of the Rapid Bus Operation Department, as well as a presentation from the Arab Forum for Smart Cities and a presentation from the Engineering Research Group for Smart Transport Systems at our University presented by Dr. Taqwa Al Hadidi.

Furthermore, Eng. Yanal Al Hares who is a current MA student gave a presentation that included his thesis in Smart Transport Systems under the title "The Use of Smart Parking Systems in the Parking Lots of Al-Ahliyya Amman University", followed by a panel session between attendees and participants.



What is bilingualism?

Defining bilingualism in just a few words is not easy, as each individual has different bilingual characteristics. There may be distinctions between ability and use of a language, or differences in proficiency between the two languages

- Simply it is the ability to use two languages. (Franson, 2009)
- The ability to express oneself with ease in two languages.(Blin, 2013)

A REAL BILINGUAL KNOWS BOTH LANGUAGES PERFECTLY".

One of the main misconceptions about bilinguals is that they are equally proficient with both languages in speaking, listening, writing and reading as well as having a perfect knowledge of their respective cultures.

People often think that children will pick up languages if they're simply exposed to them. How vereresearch shows that it takes consistency, commitment, and creative reinforcements, inside and outside their homes, for children to learn and maintain a second language. Keeping in mind that they should interact with native speakers.

Bilinguals are not as "lucky" as you think. Most of the world is actually bilingual. With more and more marriages between people from different countries, it is very common to have two or more languages spoken within a relationship or at home. 60% to 75% of the world are bilinguals (Baker, 2000).



MIXING LANGUAGES IS A SIGN OF FAKE BILINGUALISM AND IS USED TO SHOW OFF "

Bilinguals combine two languages in the same sentences or situations known as; "code-mixing". And in my opinion this is a sign of linguistic sophistication.


05. BRINGUALISM CAUSES CONFUSION AND DELAYS LANGUAGE ACQUISITION "

Researches have shown that both bilingual and monolingual children acquire their first word at the same time.


WHAT GOES IN THE BRAINS OF THOSE BABIES WHO GREW UP IN HOUSEHOLDS WHERE TWO LANGUAGES ARE SPOKEN AT THE SAME TIME?

To answer this question, we will look at the results of a study in I-LABS(Institute for learning & Brain Sciences). They brought 11 months babies into the lab. Half of them had one parent that was a native speaker of Spanish and the other one was a native speaker of english. The other half of the babies had their both parents native English speakers.

They used (MEG:Magnetoencephalography) that measures the magnatic fields produced by the brains. During the study the babies where exposed to english and spanish phonemes, and they measured their brain responces. The brains of monolingual babies were specialized to process the sounds of English only. However, the bilingual babies were specialized to process the sounds of both languages Spanish and English. Which means that the <u>baby brain specializes to process whatever language or languages are present in the environment.</u>








AND...

The prefrontal-cortex which is the part that we use to direct our attention, to switch back and forth between different tasks to do and to think flexibly. Bilingual babies had stronger brain activity and stronger brain responses to language sounds specifically in these prefrontal regions. BUT WHY? The constant switching back and forth between 2 different languages provides for the brain, exercises that strengthens these brain networks participate attention that switching. And this provides a cognitive boost to the bilinguals.
