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Al-Ahliyya Amman University holds a seminar on Traffic Safety in cooperation with the Public Security Directorate



The Deanship of Student Affairs at our University held an awareness seminar under the title “Traffic Safety” in cooperation with the Public Security Directorate represented by the Community Police Department (CPD) and the Jordanian Traffic Institute (JTI). The Seminar took place at the Hourani auditorium with the participation of more than 100 students from various faculties.

Dr. Khaled Al-Sheyab, the Assistant Dean of Student Affairs started the seminar by welcoming the officers of the Public Security Directorate and all attendees. Dr. Al-Sheyab emphasized the willingness and eagerness of all national security

services to provide a safe and secured life; and from here, the need arises to spread continuous awareness lectures carried out by the CPD and the JTI in the field of public and traffic safety.

Captain Motaz Al-Majali from the Traffic Institute underlined the importance of all Jordanian society in having sufficient awareness of the dangers that may threaten public and traffic safety through certain committed practices during graduation ceremonies, such as bullets shooting and walking on the roads which puts the lives of citizens in risk.

Moreover, Captain Nour Al-Din Al-Othman from the CPD also highlighted the main cause of traffic accidents, which is the human element, representing 98% of the causes of traffic accidents in Jordan. Hence, stressing the need to spread full awareness among all vehicle drivers on safe driving, periodic maintenance of vehicles and most importantly speed control.

Major Eng. Mohammed Al-Daboubi from the JTI concluded the seminar by emphasizing drivers ethics, commitment to speed limits and the importance of surveillance camera on roads to control speed violators and ensure traffic safety.

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

Organizational Design for Quality of Life and Sustainability

Quality of life (QoL) in an organization refers to systems and structures maintained by the management to make the workplace environment conducive to employees' maximum productivity. It results from human resource management (HRM) efforts that enable employees to participate in shaping the organizational environment, methods, and outcomes. A design for QoL creates synergies between the policies and processes of an organization to enhance its business culture. This develops a supportive environment to enhance employee behaviors.



Sustainable development is an overarching objective of HRM in the current corporate dynamics as it affects the quality of an organization's relationship with stakeholders. Organizational management must design and implement systems to exploit its resources productively and sustainably. The concept of sustainability exists at the strategic and operational levels of organizations. It is perceived from the perspective of the triple bottom lines: the people-social equity bottom line, the planet-environmental bottom line, and profit-the economic bottom line. Although all three bottom

lines are important for the success of organizations, research excessively favors the economic and environmental aspects of sustainability, with minimal interest in social sustainability involving employees, customers, and local communities. From a business perspective, social sustainability refers to the understanding of the impact of corporations on people and the executive actions to maximize the positive effects and minimize or eliminate the negative ones.

My last Published paper with my colleagues Dr. Hakem Sharari and Dr. Abdullah Helalat was about “Organizational Design for Quality of Life and Sustainability” Published in Journal of Legal, Ethical and regulatory issues to investigate the organizational design for employee QoL and sustainability, the summary of the published article was as the following:

The concept of sustainability exists in the business and management literature and is studied from the economic, environmental, and social perspectives. While the economic and environmental perspectives are sufficiently researched, less attention is paid to social sustainability. This paper investigates the impact of organizational design for quality of life (human development, artefacts, fair payment, values, health and wellness) on employee sustainability (job performance, job motivation, job commitment, job retention). Results showed that organizations should improve employee sustainability by investing in the appropriate values, physical artefacts, and health and wellness programs. Results also showed that the key elements defining quality of life within a workplace affect employee job performance, motivation, commitment, and retention. The paper, accordingly, recommends organizations adopt approaches to design their work environments (creating proper artefacts, investing in health and wellness programs, providing sufficient payments, helping employees develop their careers) to enhance employee sustainability. The paper contributes to understanding the relationship between the organizational design for quality of life and employee sustainability.
