
It is important for countries in the Middle East to adapt to the rapidly changing technological landscape and equip their citizens with the skills and knowledge needed to thrive in the 21st century.

AAU signs an agreement with Windsor Brokers












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A Memorandum of Understanding between AAU and Kittahya Dumlupinar University





Innovation in Education

Innovation is solving problems in a new, more effective way that meets new requirements or needs. Innovation in education is concerned with improving all aspects of students' learning, and this means flexibility of the teacher, curriculum and following practices and strategies that stimulate innovation. Adopting innovation in education develops students' different thinking processes that develop their creativity and problem-solving skills and make them productive individuals in their future careers.

Innovation in education is not only the use of technological tools in the educational learning process, as some believe, but it is a broader and more comprehensive concept that aims to prompt equity, improve the quality of learning and includes the adoption of systems, policies, strategies and tools that allow access to education and make it more efficient and



effective. Employing technological tools in education is part of innovation in education. Technological tools contribute to supporting students' new ideas and enable them to find innovative solutions.

Qualifying the teacher is the main pillar of preparing innovative classes that are considered innovative students. The innovative teacher motivates students and stimulates their motivation towards learning and creates opportunities for challenge and problem solving, and allows discussion and reflection, develops skills of cooperation, communication, critical, creative and innovative thinking, and gives students leadership roles, freedom of expression and the courage of adventure. Innovative teacher uses modern strategies for learning that support students' innovation, such as project-based learning, flipped learning, use technology in educational tasks, such as the use of augmented reality, virtual reality, educational robots, instructional games, applications based on artificial intelligence and expert systems. In order to achieve innovation in education, educational institutions must adopt modern educational policies and systems that promote innovation, such as open learning, distance learning, and provide innovative learning environments and tools that take into account students' characteristics, needs, and learning styles, and provide them with learning opportunities at any time and place.

The International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) mentioned the latest four innovative trends in (K-12) education, which are online learning, as many schools have become permanently offering virtual learning for their students, and are adopting innovative practices such as blended learning and flipped learning. Secondly, Data literacy, as considered an essential skill, which is the ability to collect, organize, visualize, analyze, interpret and share data with others. Third: Employing technology in education, as

technology contributes to facilitating students' cooperation, communication and developing their various skills. Finally, rethinking the teacher's roles in order to add fun to teaching.

In the Arab world, educational institutions have taken serious steps in the field of innovation, such as providing innovation and leadership centers in their institutions and adopting blended learning in the higher education sector, but there is still a gap between reality and expectations. In general, the financial support represented in providing the necessary infrastructure constitutes a challenge facing innovation in the education sector in the Arab world. More specifically, Al-Ahliyya Amman University presents a model for supporting innovation. In addition to the infrastructure that the university provides for innovation and its adoption of the latest educational strategies and practices that support innovation and its use of the latest technological tools in education, the university has established a center for innovation and excellence, which act as a hub to pursue the innovative ideas of students and teachers at Al- Ahliyya Amman University. The center seeks to encourage, adopt and implement distinguished ideas by creating partnerships, platforms, products and affecting policies.

In a recent study that I conducted aimed at identifying Undergraduates' Perspectives and Challenges of Online Learning during the COVID-19 Pandemic, published in the "Journal of Social Studies Education Research," the results showed the students' preferred online learning over the traditional method, and students encountered some challenges such as unreliable internet connections, slow e-learning platforms, a lack of information and communication technology skills. In another study, also published in the same journal, aimed at identifying gender differences in the quality of academic motivation among students in light of the self-determination theory, that included a number of undergraduates students who studied online during the COVID-19 pandemic, its results revealed statistically significant differences in the quality of academic motivation among students in favor of female students, and the study recommended to carefully consider online learning environment and employ intrinsic motivation strategies to enhance students' motivation quality.
