

It is important for countries in the Middle East to adapt to the rapidly changing technological landscape and equip their citizens with the skills and knowledge needed to thrive in the 21st century.






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From Our President

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The National Center for innovation and our university formalize their partnership






Relationship Of Inflammatory Mediators And Sex-related Parameters In Jordanian Adult Men Patients With Covid-19

Background:

Recent epidemiological data suggest that Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) has a gender predisposition, with men being more seriously affected than women. Furthermore, older men accounting for most deaths. Therefore, this study aimed to investigate the serum testosterone, inhibin B, intrleukin-6 (IL-6) and tumor necrosis factor-alpha (TNF-a) levels in different age groups of Jordanian males with SARS-CoV2 infection and to evaluate the correlation of these markers in male patients with COVID-19.

Methods:

This study was performed on 157 selected individuals divided into two groups; COVID-19 patients and healthy controls. The participants of each group were further divided into two subgroups based on the age (20-50) years and (51-80) years age groups. The biochemical tests that were performed in this research are testosterone, inhibin-B, TNF-a, and IL-6.


Results:

The levels of IL-6 were significantly higher in COVID-19 patients than healthy individuals $(7.63 \pm 6.30$

vs. 5.54 ± 2.10 , P=0.006). Similarly, the difference between the levels of TNF-a in the study groups were statistically significant (P=0.001). The mean testosterone levels in COVID-19 patients and healthy controls were 1.53 ± 1.24 and 3.87 ± 1.44 , respectively (P<0.001), whereas the mean inhibin B levels in COVID-19 patients (54.29 ± 7.33) were lower than in healthy controls (64.14 ± 37.66) with P = 0.011. TNF-a was significantly and positively correlated with age (r = 0.263, P=0.018) and IL-6 (r =0.245, P=0.027). Inhibin B had a significant, but negative correlation with TNF-a (r = -0.326, P = 0.003).

Conclusions:

It can be concluded that most men seeking medical attention with symptomatic COVID-19 had low testosterone and inhibin B levels with increased both IL-6 and TNF-a, which are independent of age conforming the deleterious effects of SARS-CoV-2 infection on testicular function and immune response induction. Dark mornings, darker evenings, and chilly gray days mean winter is here — and with the coldest season come the winter blues. There is no clinical diagnosis for the "winter blues," but experts at the National Institute of Health say the so-called winter blues are common and are usually marked by feeling more down than usual such as sad, less energized, or less interested in activities one usually enjoys. So if colder weather and shorter days cause you to feel the winter blues, you're not alone as it is not uncommon to experience fatigue, sadness, difficulty concentrating, and a disruption in your sleep schedule during the winter season. For some, this mood change is temporary and easily managed with lifestyle modifications. However, for others, the winter blues can turn into a more severe type of depression called seasonal affective disorder or SAD. While you may not be able to change the weather or amount of daylight during the winter, there are strategies you can do to overcome the winter blues.

Take a Break From the News

Being indoors more often means an increase in screen time. And if this time is spent consuming a non-stop news cycle, you may feel an increase in the winter blues. To help minimize stress, sadness, and despair from the news, try to limit the amount of time you spend in front of a screen. If possible, schedule one hour for news. You can watch this in one sitting or break it up into time limits.

Boost Your Mood with Food

A simple change to boost your mood is to consider the food you eat. Consuming protein with breakfast, lunch, and dinner can enhance mood and prevent sugar and carb cravings later in the day.

Also, including foods high in vitamin D such as fatty fish, fish oil, and vitamin D-fortified foods like milk, orange juice, breakfast cereal, yogurt, and other food sources can help balance mood.

According to one meta-analysis, researchers found that people with depression have low vitamin D levels, and people with low vitamin D are at a greater risk of depression.

Keep Up Your Sleep Routine

Sleep is a huge component of mood. Without adequate, regular sleep, psychologists say our circadian rhythm can be disrupted, which also disrupts cortisol rhythms and impacts hormone production.

Practice Physical Activity

Physical activity has been shown to boost mood, decrease the symptoms of depression, and reduce stress. Start slowly and build up to 30 to 60 minutes a day, five days a week of aerobic exercise, strength training, yoga, or other fitness-related activities.

Finally, getting outside and exposing the body to sunlight while exercising can improve energy, mood levels and lead to better sleep.
