Policy Statement	 Deans Council Resolution No.: 2023/59 AAU is committed to: Ifreedom in Research and Publication: Upholding the right of faculty and students to conduct research and to publish or disseminate findings without undue interference or restriction, subject to the highest standards of scholarly integrity and ethical conduct. Recognizing that academic freedom in research and publication comes with the responsibility to ensure accuracy, rigor, and adherence to ethical and legal standards. Freedom in Teaching: Ensuring that faculty have the freedom to discuss their subject matter in the classroom, explore diverse theoretical perspectives, and present material relevant to their curriculum, while maintaining respect for the intellectual rights of others. Policy Purpose	 4. Institutional Autonomy: Respecting the autonomy of the university in making decisions based on academic considerations and in accordance with its mission, free from undue external influence. Acknowledging that the university has the responsibility to maintain academic standards, ensure the quality of its programs, and protect the rights of its community members. 5. Public Engagement: Supporting the right of faculty, staff, and students to participate in public discourse and to comment on matters of public interest, recognizing that such engagement contributes to the role of the university as a societal critic and conscience. Clarifying that individuals who participate in public discourse should make clear when they are speaking as private citizens and when they are representing the views of the university. The purpose of this policy is to affirm AAU's commitment to upholding the principles of academic freedom and to clarify the associated responsibilities. This policy aims to foster an environment that encourages free inquiry, open exchange of ideas, and the pursuit of knowledge and understanding, while also recognizing the responsibilities that accompany these freedoms.
Policy Scope	This policy applies to all faculty, staff, and students of AAU and governs all academic activities, including teaching, research, publication, and public engagement.
Policy Responsibilities	 All University Members are responsible for: Exercising their academic freedoms in a manner that reflects a commitment to scholarly inquiry, intellectual integrity, and respect for the rights and dignity of others. The University Administration is responsible for: Safeguarding the principles of academic freedom and ensuring that university policies and practices do not impose undue restrictions on the academic community. Addressing any infringements upon academic freedom in a timely and fair manner.
Policy Compliance	Allegations of violations of academic freedom or failure to uphold the responsibilities associated with it should be addressed through the appropriate university procedures. The



	university is committed to investigating such allegations promptly and resolving them fairly.
