	<ol> <li>Prevention of Introduction:         <ul> <li>Implementing measures to prevent the introduction of alien species that are known to be invasive or potentially harmful to local ecosystems.</li> <li>Ensuring that all landscaping, construction, and research activities are conducted in a manner that minimizes the risk of introducing alien species.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Monitoring and Early Detection:         <ul> <li>Regularly monitoring university lands and facilities for the presence of alien species, with a focus on early detection of invasive species.</li> <li>Encouraging the university community to report sightings of alien species and providing resources and training for species identification.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Rapid Response and Control:         <ul> <li>Developing and implementing rapid response protocols for the management and control of alien species, particularly those identified as invasive or harmful.</li> <li>Utilizing environmentally responsible and scientifically supported methods for the control and eradication of invasive alien species.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Restoration of Native Biodiversity:         <ul> <li>Supporting efforts to restore habitats that have been impacted by alien species through the reintroduction of native species and the rehabilitation of natural ecosystems.</li> <li>Promoting the use of native plant species in landscaping and habitat restoration projects on</li> </ul> </li> </ol>

	management, their impacts on local ecosystems,	
	and effective control methods.

Policy Purpose	The purpose of this policy is to outline AAU's commitment to	
	the management of alien (non-native) species on university	
	property and in university operations. This policy aims to	
	prevent the introduction of invasive alien species, minimize	
	their impact on local ecosystems, and promote native	
	biodiversity and ecosystem health.	
Policy Scope	This policy applies to all university lands, facilities, and	
	operations that may be affected by or contribute to the	
	introduction and spread of alien species. This includes	
	landscaping and grounds maintenance, construction projects,	
	research activities, and educational programs.	
Policy Responsibilities	1. The Sustainability Office is responsible for:	
	<ul> <li>Coordinating the implementation of this policy.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Providing guidance and support to departments</li> </ul>	
	and units on alien species management	
	practices.	
	2. Facilities Management is responsible for:	
	<ul> <li>Implementing best practices in landscaping and</li> <li>grounds maintaneous to prevent the introduction</li> </ul>	
	grounds maintenance to prevent the introduction	
	and spread of alien species.	
	<ul> <li>Participating in monitoring, control, and restoration activities related to alien species.</li> </ul>

1	3. The Research Office is responsible for:	



	<ul> <li>Ensuring that research activities comply with</li> </ul>	
	this policy and contribute positively to the	
	management of alien species.	
	4. Academic Departments are responsible for:	
	<ul> <li>Integrating topics related to alien species</li> </ul>	
	management into relevant courses and research	
	activities.	
	5. All members of the university community are	
	responsible for:	
	<ul> <li>Being informed about alien species issues and</li> </ul>	
	participating in the university's efforts to	
	manage and control alien species.	
Policy Compliance	Non-compliance with this policy may result in a review of	
	operations and procedures to identify areas for improvement.	
	Continuous non-compliance may lead to further actions as	
	deemed necessary by the university administration.	
Policy Review	This policy will be reviewed and, if necessary, revised every	
	year or as needed to ensure it remains effective, reflects the	
	latest scientific understanding and best practices in alien	
	species management, and aligns with the university's	
	sustainability goals.
