	AAU is committed to:  1. Compliance with Regulations:  Adhering to all local, state, and federal regulations regarding the management of hazardous waste.  Ensuring that all employees who manage or handle hazardous waste are properly trained and informed about relevant regulations and university policies.  2. Hazardous Waste Minimization:  Actively promoting practices that reduce the volume and toxicity of hazardous waste generated by university activities.  Encouraging the substitution of less hazardous materials and the implementation of waste reduction techniques in research, teaching, and maintenance operations.  3. Proper Hazardous Waste Handling and Storage:  Ensuring that hazardous waste is properly identified, labeled, and stored in a manner that minimizes the risk of accidents, contamination, or releases to the environment.  Providing secure and compliant storage facilities for hazardous waste, and maintaining them in accordance with regulatory requirements.  4. Safe and Compliant Disposal:  Coordinating the disposal of hazardous waste through licensed waste disposal contractors who are authorized to handle and dispose of such

Policy Purpose	The purpose of this policy is to establish AAU's commitment to the safe, responsible, and compliant management of hazardous waste generated from university operations. This policy aims to protect human health, the environment, and property by ensuring proper handling, storage, treatment, and disposal of hazardous waste in accordance with all applicable regulations and best practices.
Policy Scope	This policy applies to all university activities that generate, store, handle, or dispose of hazardous waste, including
	academic research, laboratory work, maintenance operations,
	and construction projects. It covers all forms of hazardous waste, including but not limited to chemical, biological,
